INTRODUCTION

All Academy's within the Trust have their own specific Safeguarding Policy which is reviewed and updated (when required) annually by the Local Support Board, in order to protect and safeguard their students.

In addition to their own policy, Academies in the Trust adhere to the following overarching Safeguarding Policies and Procedures:

- All new staff recruited in line with the SCR and Vetting Policy.
- All Academies have a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL), and a Deputy DSL.
- All new staff receive a site and safeguarding induction during their first week of employment, which includes training on the Academy's safeguarding policy and procedures, carried out by the DSL.
- All staff complete annual Safeguarding and Prevent training as a minimum.
